

Post Secondary Sessions - 2018 - University - Items to Discuss

1. Requirements for University
 - ENG4U + 5 other 4U/4M classes (add'l requirements may exist for some programs)
 - Required courses must be included in Admissions Average
2. 101 vs 105 application for OUAC
 - You will be completing an Undergrad (101) application if you are currently a secondary student at Central.
 - If you have taken a GAP year where you have do not take any high school courses, you would complete a 105 application.
3. Collection of Marks to OUAC
 - Your marks are sent in automatically.
 - Semester 1 final marks, semester 2 midterm marks and semester 2 final marks are sent to OUAC.
 - Please verify your marks and check the OUAC site to ensure all of your marks (including online) appear.
4. Login / Passwords
 - Students pick up their OUAC # and login information in Guidance
 - Students must pick up their OEN (Ontario Education Number) and mark verification sheet in Guidance
5. Collaborative Programs - do I apply to university or college?
 - a list of programs can be found in electronicinfo.ca
 - Click on Programs -> Discover Other Options -> Collaborative University and College Programs
6. Deferrals
 - Circumstances happen that may stop you from fulfilling the acceptance of an offer of admission. If you wish to defer your acceptance, you must contact the school to request a deferral.

 - students are required to complete a separate online application (different due dates)
 - schools connected to OUAC: Acadia, Bishops, UBC, Calgary, Concordia, Dalhousie, McGill, UNB, St Mary's, Simon Fraser, Victoria (these schools have access to your transcript information)

1. Requirements for College
 - ENG4C + required courses
 - differentials/admission procedures (Math @Fanshawe)
2. Collection of marks
 - Your marks are sent in automatically. Please verify your marks and check the OCAS site to ensure all of your marks (including online) appear.
 - Semester 1 midterm and final marks, semester 2 midterm and final marks are sent to OCAS
3. Login / Passwords
 - College: students make up their own username (email) and password.
 - Students can pick up their OEN in Guidance office
 - OEN - Ontario Education Number -Student number is 000 and then OEN on the OCAS site
4. Collaborative Programs - do I apply to university or college?
 - a list of programs can be found in electronicinfo.ca
 - Click on Programs -> Discover Other Options -> Collaborative University and College Programs
5. Deferrals

9. Alternate offers
 - Some colleges will accept you into a similar course to the one that you applied for (ex. Pre-health instead of paramedics)
 - Do your research!
10. Highly competitive programs
 - Depending on the program, colleges may require specific subjects as prerequisites, and they may set minimum grade cut-offs in these subjects. Some programs may also require a portfolio, essay or other supporting documentation.
