Read the criteria of each award carefully to confirm eligibility.

Please note that many awards do require top marks.

All award amounts are approximate and may or may not be awarded every year.

Students should be aware that the due dates listed are not always accurate and may change from year to year.

GROUP A - **COMMUNITY AWARDS** (School Application Form required)

These awards are determined by the School Awards Committee using the S.C.S.S. application form distributed through Guidance Department. Due date for this application is June 1 each year.

1. Harry WALKER Achievement Award

plaque + \$150

Awarded to a graduating student pursuing post-secondary studies, a skilled trade or an apprenticeship. Recipient must have been a participant in minor hockey for a minimum of three years (Novice-Midget) or the high school SMHA recreation level. Work ethic to achieve is important.

2. Norah BELL Citizenship Award

\$300

Awarded annually to the graduating student who best exemplifies the standards held by the late Norah Bell, namely academic excellence, active participation in cocurricular activities and a genuine commitment and service to others.

3. (Lions') R.N. BISSONNETTE Scholarship

\$750

Awarded to a graduate student who is enrolled in a university or college at the postsecondary level. A high level of scholarship and involvement in community and school activities will be considered.

4. **CENTRAL Centennial Scholarship**

\$270

Awarded annually to graduating students of high academic standing and exceptional co-curricular commitment who are enrolled in post-secondary studies.

5. CHARTWELLS Award

\$500

Awarded annually to a deserving student who is continuing studies at the postsecondary level.

6. Peter MARANGER & Associates Inc. "Better Place" Award

2 x **\$200**

The Co-operators logo is "A Better Place for You". We believe that communities become better places though volunteerism and unselfish service of caring individuals. This award recognizes one female and one male student who have achieved the highest number of community volunteer hours through activity with a variety of organizations and initiatives over their high school career.

7. COOPER-Standard Automotive Award

\$750

Awarded to a graduating student pursuing university studies in Engineering. Academic performance, demonstrated leadership ability through school and community involvement and financial need will be considered.

8. Stephen WICKERT Memorial Award

\$300

Awarded to a graduating student who best fulfills the following criteria: i) must come from a single-parent family, ii) must be an average student, iii) must have a record of community involvement, iv) must have a record of co-curricular involvement, v) must be entering college, preferably Fanshawe.

9. Stratford Concert Band Mervyn DOERR Memorial Scholarship

\$500

Awarded to an active member with the Stratford Concert Band who is continuing their education at a university, college or technical institution.

10. (Rotary) Wilfrid P. GREGORY Award

\$1200 (Renewable)

Awarded to a graduating student who is attending a post-secondary institution, pursuing certification in a college, skilled trades or apprenticeship program. Student must have demonstrated community involvement through volunteering or membership in a community organization. Financial need may be considered.

11. FIO Automotive Canada Corporation Scholarship

\$500

Awarded to a graduating student who is enrolled in a post-secondary institution in an applied technical field (i.e. engineering, skilled trades, etc.), has obtained outstanding academic recognition and has demonstrated significant involvement in extra-curricular activities.

12. FESTIVAL Jubilee IODE Award

\$500

Awarded to a graduating student who is continuing with post-secondary education, has not received other awards, has overcome some adversity/challenge, has worked hard and is deserving of recognition.

13. Coral Irene FLIN Memorial Award

\$45

Awarded annually to a deserving graduating student. Academic achievement and financial need are considered.

14. **HONEYWELL Scholarship**

suspended until further notice

Awarded to a graduating student enrolled in a post-secondary program who has worked hard to overcome unusual adversity while maintaining a good academic average.

15. LIEUTENANT Governor's Community Volunteer Award

Insignia

Awarded to a graduating student who has demonstrated exemplary community involvement.

16. **OSSTF Bursary**

(1 or 2)

\$400

Awarded annually to a deserving student who is enrolled in post-secondary studies. Marks and need are considered.

17. Lieutenant Bob PATTERSON Award

trophy + \$1000

Awarded to the student at Central displaying outstanding leadership and contribution to the overall extra-curricular program. The applicant should be involved in the community outside the school, an outstanding leader and sportsperson. All things being equal, the person with the best academic record will be the winner. The minimum average marks would be 65%.

18. Maurice & Myrtle REINHART Scholarship

2 x **\$800**

Awarded to one male and one female student who have achieved good marks (80% average in 6 4U/M), are pursuing post-secondary education or training and who may not have received other awards.

19. ROYAL Canadian Legion Awards

3 x **\$333**

Awarded annually to 3 deserving students who are enrolled in post-secondary studies.

20. (Rotary) Dr. David SMITH Honour

2 x **\$1200** (Renewable)

Awarded annually to two graduating students proceeding to a post-secondary institution in Ontario who combines academic merit with school and community involvement and financial need. This award is renewable for each year of post-secondary studies up to a total of 4 years.

21. David Howard SMITH Memorial Award

\$200

Awarded to a graduate student who is enrolled in a university or college. High marks are not a requirement but the student must be from a single-parent family. Financial need is a requirement.

22. STRATFORD Minor Sports Council Scholarship

\$200

Awarded to a student participant of the Stratford Minor Sports with outstanding leadership skills particularly with the Minor Sports system, has exemplified the spirit of sportsmanship, scholastic determination and who is continuing with post-secondary education.

23. ALAN SLATER Memorial Scholarship

\$500

Awarded to a student who has an interest in bettering his/her community as demonstrated through volunteering or community work. The student is entering a program in the field of science.

24.CENTRAL Students' Advisory Council College Award

\$200

Awarded to the graduating student enrolled in a Canadian college who has a minimum of 75% in 6 senior-level courses (non-4U) and who can demonstrate a financial need.

GROUP B - COMMUNITY AWARDS

(Special Application Forms Provided by Affiliated Organization <u>OR</u> School Application Form with Additional Criteria)

These awards are determined by a committee within the organization providing the award. Students must obtain a special application and/or see a counsellor in Guidance Department for details. If the award requires a school nomination or a student is interested in being considered, the student should see their counsellor well in advance of the due date. Due dates must be adhered to for eligibility.

1. The Ted BLOWES Bursary

\$500

Awarded annually to the graduating student who best exemplifies the standards held by the late Ted Blowes. The nominee must have contributed to the community, school life, volunteer work, have a good academic background (but not necessarily highest marks), demonstrate leadership and have an interest in the environment. Each school can submit up to two entries along with a 500-word essay. Application deadline: May or June

2. Stratford and District Horticultural Society

\$500

Awarded to a student planning a career in horticulture, landscaping or agriculture. The recipient must be a graduate who is enrolled in post-secondary studies in one of these areas. Essay due in May. Students compete with students from Mitchell, St. Marys and Stratford. Please email Sdhs1878@outlook.com for more information.

3. Theatrical Wardrobe Union I.A.T.S.E. Local 924 Award

\$750

Awarded annually to a graduating student who is pursuing post-secondary studies with their emphasis being on Theatrical Costuming and has been accepted into a technical theatre program. Applicants will provide a short letter outlining their theatrical experience and are they are intent on pursuing. Any documentation supporting the application is welcome. Applications due in May.

4. Tom FAIRBAIRN Memorial Scholarship

\$500

Awarded to a student who played SHMA for a minimum of five hockey seasons. Please check the website for the Stratford Warriors for more details and an application form. Applications are available in December each year and are due in February.

5. **FOURTEEN Roses Bursary**

\$1000

Awarded to a graduating female student of a publicly funded secondary school in Perth County who is enrolled in a recognized university pursuing a program in engineering, applied math or applied sciences. The nominee must have contributed to the community, school life, have a good academic background (but not necessarily highest marks), demonstrate leadership and be in need of financial assistance. One name per school is submitted to the Zonta Club of Stratford selection committee. Applications are due in June.

6. Stephen FRANCIS Memorial Award

plaque + \$1500

Awarded to a graduating student (or students) registered in a Canadian post-secondary institution (preferably university). Preference is given to a student with proven athletic ability (preferably volleyball) with intention of continuing a sport at the university level. Academic achievement is not a major consideration. Financial need will be favoured if a choice must be made between deserving athletes. SCSS Scholarship Committee will forward nominations.

7. University of TORONTO National Book Award and/or Scholarship

Awarded to exceptional students whose circumstances have restricted their opportunities to participate in school and community activities. Awards range in value from a book to \$12 500 each year for 4 years of undergraduate study. Applications are due in October.

8. Glen HODGINS Memorial Award

\$500

Awarded to successful applicant who is pursuing a career in the environment field and is taking an environment-related program at university or college. Financial need considered. Applications are due in June.

9. MARKLEVITZ Architect Scholarship in Design and Development Awarded to a graduating student with the highest mark in the "design and development" aspects of a broad-based technological studies program. The student must be furthering their studies in the technology field. Applications are due in June.

10. Jason MERCER Memorial Award

Plaque + \$100

Awarded to a graduating student who has demonstrated a strong interest and passion for music, dependability, conscientiousness, enthusiasm and cooperation. The recipient must be a resident of the Stratford area. SCSS Scholarship Committee will forward nominations.

11. Elsie MEYER Memorial Scholarship

\$500

Awarded annually to a student in the community who is graduating from a Perth County secondary school and who is pursuing further education. The candidate is to have positively contributed to the community and/or the services for the mentally disadvantaged. The award is made by the Stratford Area Association for Community Living through an application and recommendation by the school. The application must be accompanied by 2 letters of reference and a personal statement of eligibility. Applications are due in June.

12. Ela MOLL Memorial Scholarship

Awarded to a graduating student of one of the 3 Stratford secondary schools who is pursuing post-secondary studies in Visual Art. A portfolio submitted by the end of May to a committee of the Gallery/Stratford is the basis for consideration.

13. OXFORD District Women's Institute Conference Scholarship

\$1000

Awarded to a 4-H member who resides in Oxford County and is attending a postsecondary institution. Applicant must write an essay and complete an application form available through the O.D.W.I. Applications are due in February.

14. PERTH County Federation of Agriculture

\$250

Awarded to successful applicant who is enrolled in post secondary studies in an agricultural related program. Must apply directly to the Perth County Federation committee.

15.West Perth FIRE FIGHTERS Association and Mitchell Kinsmen's \$1000 Club for Pre Fire Service Education

Awarded to a resident of West Perth who has been accepted into the Pre Fire Service Program. A student's marks and community involvement may be considered if there are more than two candidates. Students need to contact firehall@westperth.com.

16. TAVISTOCK Rotary "The Mike Yarich Entrepreneurial Challenge"

1st prize **\$1000** 2nd prize **\$ 500**

Awarded to a graduating student residing in Tavistock or the local rural area who has been accepted into a post-secondary program. The student will be selected from a competition through Tavistock Rotary. The competition involves writing a maximum 500-word proposal for the establishment of a profit or not-for-profit organization for Tavistock and the surrounding area. The award is not dependent on school merit, character referrals or financial needs. Application submission is due in May.

17. SCHULICH Leader Scholarship

Central will nominate one graduating student who possesses at least two of the three selection criteria:

- 1. Academic Excellence
- 2. Outstanding Community, Business or Entrepreneurial Leadership
- 3. Financial Need

In addition, the nominee must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident, in their final year of secondary school and pursuing an undergraduate degree in a STEM program. Nomination due in January or February.

18.HEALTHCARE Inspiration Event Scholarship

\$500

The applicant must be a Perth County resident, attending post-secondary in the fall and be enrolled in a healthcare or healthcare related program. The student must have a passion for rural healthcare and have an interest to work in a rural area. Applications due in late March.

19.MITCHELL and District Agricultural Society Bursary

\$250

Awarded to a student who has participated in the activities of the Society including the Mitchell Fair. Applications due in May.

20. Kiwanis Club of Stratford - Student Awards

\$750

Students receiving this award are community minded, civic spirited, willing volunteers in their school community, and/or the community at large. Deserving students have demonstrated any or some of the following qualifications: - a potential for leadership through service; - empathy and kindness; - involvement in extra curricular activities; - a spirit of cooperation and engagement, generosity and unselfishness; - diligence in their work and a desire to learn. Note: A student with financial needs who exhibits any or some of the foregoing criteria will be given special consideration.

GROUP C

(No Application Form required) All award amounts are approximate.

1. J.F. ADAMSON Scholarship in Chemistry

\$100

Awarded to the student who attained the highest mark (over 80%) in 4U Chemistry and who is in regular attendance at a recognized university and enrolled in a course in Science, Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy, Agriculture, Forestry or some other course relating mainly to Science.

2. ALUMNI Spirit Award

\$150

Awarded to a graduating student (selected by graduating peers) who has demonstrated leadership and spirit within the school during the high school years.

3. ARMY, Navy and Air Force Veterans' Awards

\$100 each

Awarded to graduating students with the highest aggregate marks who are proceeding to post-secondary education. One award for university-bound and one for college-bound students.

4. TRILLIUM Mutual Insurance Award

pen set + \$150

Awarded to the valedictorian for the graduating class.

5. Dr. John W. BEAN Memorial Science Award

\$150

Presented to the Central student who has made an outstanding contribution to the school's Science and Environmental program.

6. The Arden Park Dental Award

\$ 500

The Award recognizes a student whose outstanding qualities of character and citizenship have been directed into programs and services that have positively influenced fellow students and have contributed to the well-being of the school and the community. This student has also made an effort to improve their overall average.

7. FESTIVAL HYDRO Scholarship

\$500

Awarded annually to a student who is enrolled in a post secondary electrical engineering/technician/technologist program (university or college) or a powerline technician program.

8. CANADIAN Federation of University Women's Club (CFUW) of Stratford Award for French in Memory of L. Mary Rayner

\$300

Given annually to a female student from Stratford Central Secondary School with the highest aggregate mark in a French course at the 4U level. The winner must be continuing education at university in the fall.

9. CANADIAN Federation of University Women's Club (CFUW) of Stratford \$500 Scholarship for Science

Awarded annually to a female student from a Stratford secondary school with the highest aggregate marks in two sciences from a choice of physics, chemistry, and biology at the 4U level. The winner must be continuing education at university in the fall in the field of science.

10. CARTER Scholarship

Names of county's top students are submitted for consideration by the Board of Education.

11. CENTRAL Students' Advisory Council Geography Award

\$100

\$50

Awarded to a graduating student continuing post-secondary education who has obtained the highest mark in CGR4M.

12. CENTRAL Students' Council Leadership Scholarship

\$200

Awarded to a deserving student who has been a member of executive or general council for at least three years, is enrolled in a post-secondary institution and who has been a positive leader/role model at S.C.S.S. Selection will be made by Students' Council and its advisors.

13. The David B WRIGHT Memorial Award

\$500

Award to a graduating student who is pursuing post-secondary education in an apprenticeship, at college or at university. This student will have contributed to the vibrancy of the Central School (or Northwestern School) community—in Students' Council or the arts, through athletics or other extracurricular school clubs or activities. This student is also one who has demonstrated growth in character by demonstration thoughtfulness, humility and perseverance. And, while the recipient should be an all-around good student, he/she does not necessarily have to be a top student; in fact, the sponsor of this award would prefer that the award recognize a student who is not likely to be the recipient of other awards.

14. CRIME Stopper Bursary

\$200

Awarded to a graduating student who is continuing studies at university or college in the area of law enforcement or a related area of study. Financial need considered.

15. Marceline Allendorf GIBSON Award (combined with Werner PETTERSON) \$100 Recognizing graduating students who have achieved excellent academic results.

16. GOVERNOR-General's Academic Medal

Awarded annually to the graduating student with the highest aggregate marks in all Grade 11 and 12 courses.

17. Clifford GRIESBACH Award for Poetry

\$500

Given to the student in a Stratford secondary school who shows the most promise in the composition of poetry.

18. John "Jack" Adam HAMILTON Scholarship

\$500

Awarded to a graduating student with the highest aggregate mark Advanced Functions and Calculus and Vectors and who is pursuing post secondary education.

19. HURON Perth Association of Realtors

\$200

Awarded to a graduating student who is continuing his/her education at a postsecondary institution in the area of marketing

20. HURON-Perth District Women's Institute Education Award

\$100

Awarded to a graduating student who has achieved good marks in courses offered by Social Sciences and the Humanities department and who is continuing studies in a related field.

21. Evelyn Hazel JOHNSTON Scholarship in Mathematics

\$75

Awarded to the student who makes the highest aggregate mark on the final examinations in 4U Mathematics (must have all three from MCV4U, MHF4U, MDM4U).

22. Evelyn Hazel JOHNSTON Scholarship in Social Sciences

\$65

Awarded to the student with the highest mark in Sociology (HHS4M or HSB4M).

23. The Neigh Scholarship

2 x **\$1000**

Given in memory of Mr. G. Geoffrey Neigh and Mr. Edward D Neigh

To be awarded annually to two students, usually one male and one female who have been consistently and actively involved in one or more extracurricular activities (sports, arts, student government or other). In any given year the award can be given to two males or two females if in the view of the committee this is more appropriate. The recipient will be continuing their education within two years of graduating and should be awarded to a student who is not receiving an abundance of awards. The student must have a good academic standing.

24. (Kinsmen) Herb McCLATCHEY Memorial Award

\$750

Awarded to a graduate student who is enrolled in a university or college at the post-secondary level with the highest mark in alternately CHY4U, CPW4U, CLN4U or CGW4U. In case of a tie, the recipient will be the student who has the highest overall average of six 4U credits taken in the current year.

25. Larry MCKAY Memorial Scholarship

\$150

Awarded in alternate years to a worthy graduate of either Stratford Northwestern or Stratford Central Secondary School (Central 1997, 1999, etc.). The student applicant will have successfully completed the OSSD with a minimum of eight credits in Business Education and must be attending a community college in a business program.

26.**USBORNE & Hibbert Mutual Fire Insurance Company Scholarships** 4 x **\$100** Awarded to a graduating student attending college or university showing the most improvement.

27. RBC Award \$150

Awarded to a graduating student who is continuing with post-secondary education and has overcome an adversity/challenge and is deserving of recognition.

28. **OACETT Secondary School Technology Awards**

certificate

Ontario Association of Certified Engineering Technicians and Technologists provide awards for outstanding students entering community colleges in Engineering/Applied Science Technology: one for the student with the highest average receiving an OSSD who is entering a 3-year Technology program; one for the student with the highest average receiving an OSSD who is entering a two-year Technician program.

29. Shirley PAGE Memorial History Scholarship

\$500

Awarded to a graduating student with the highest marks in CHY4U and who is continuing studies in History at the University level. (tie breaker – overall year four marks)

30. Canadian Federation of University Women's Club (CFUW) of Stratford Achievement Award

\$350

Awarded to a young woman, a graduate of an alternative high school program with an OSSD. She must be enrolled at a recognized post secondary institution immediately following secondary school. The recipient will have shown great improvement, but not necessarily received the highest marks. Financial need may be a consideration.

31. Werner PETTERSON Scholarship

\$100

(combined with Marceline Allendorf GIBSON)

Awarded to graduating students who have demonstrated academic excellence.

32. Ontario PRINCIPAL'S Council Award for Student Leadership plaque + \$100 An award selected by the Principal in recognition of a graduating student who has demonstrated leadership.

33. James REANEY Bursary

\$200

Awarded to a student who is continuing studies in the performing arts. Financial need is a factor. Applicants must have a minimum overall average of 60% and have participated in school productions.

34. James REANEY Scholarship in the Arts

2 x **\$200**

Awarded to students who show promise or ability in the areas of the performing arts and who are pursuing further studies in the performing arts. Applicants must have at least one other arts area, with a minimum of 75%. Applicants must be in year 4.

35. R. RITZ Architectural Award

(book "Architectural Graphic Standards" - value \$220)

Awarded to a student at each high school in Stratford. Applicant must: have an OSS; be enrolled in a recognized post-secondary institution in Ontario in the academic year immediately following the final year of secondary school in a degree program in Architecture; and is not receiving any other awards.

36. JAMES A RUTHERFORD Funeral Home Scholarship

\$ 300

Awarded annually to a student who has demonstrated compassion to others. Preference given to someone entering the funeral industry or health industry (i.e. nurse, psw....)

37. SCSS Apprenticeship Achievement Award

See Guidance Department for details.

38. CFUW French Immersion Award

\$300

Awarded to the female student with the highest average in the four FIF courses having completed either the 7 or 10 credit immersion program. The winner must be continuing her post-secondary education at a recognized Canadian university in the academic year immediately following the completion of secondary school.

39. The STRATFORD Art in the Park Association Bursary

\$75

Awarded to a deserving Art student who is continuing his/her studies in Art at the university or college level.

40. STRATFORD Central Athletic Associations Award

\$200

Presented annually to a student obtaining the highest marks in PSE4U and who has contributed to the co-curricular program at Central in the year the award is received.

41. TEACHERS-Festival Liaison Council Scholarship

\$100

Awarded annually to a graduate who has made a valuable contribution to drama/theatre during his/her high school career.

42. TRADITION Mutual Fire Insurance Company Scholarship

\$300

Awarded to a graduate of Central who is enrolled in a Canadian post-secondary institution; has good marks in business studies, is continuing in the business field, has financial need, and no more than \$500 in other awards.

43. GLEN ELLIOTT Memorial Scholarship (Gallery Stratford)

\$200

Awarded to a deserving student of visual arts and is continuing post-secondary education in an arts-related program.

44. Cassie WILLIAMS Memorial Award

\$100

Awarded to a senior female soccer or field hockey player who is an active member of CAA and who acts as a positive motivator, encouraging all team members to work together. The student should have an overall 'B' average.

45. Ian GARNER Scholarship

\$1000

Awarded to a graduating student going to university or college who has improved the school in the area of athletics and who has shown school and community citizenship. Academics will be considered but is not necessary criteria.

46. C.O.P.E. (Cooperative Opportunities Providing Education) Award

\$100

Awarded to a graduating student who demonstrated strong character and optimism by overcoming personal or educational adversity. This recipient's hard work and perseverance is deserving of recognition.

47. Peggy MUELLER Memorial Scholarship

\$500

Awarded to a student pursuing a post-secondary program in a science-related field. The recipient is an enthusiastic individual who helps to foster a sense of community within the classroom and school. He/She has demonstrated a commitment to personal excellence while inspiring and helping others to succeed.

48. COOPER-Standard Automotive Bursary

5 x \$100

Awarded to five students deserving of recognition and assistance and who have demonstrated growth in the areas of business, mathematics, science, tech studies and learning services departments.

49. PETER DONALDSON Memorial Scholarship Fund

\$1500

Awarded to a Perth County resident who has a passion for the performing arts either as a performer, director or behind the scenes in production. The recipient must be entering first year of post-secondary studies at a Canadian institution to pursue studies in the performing arts. Studies may include: television, film, theatre, directing, theatre production or affiliated area.

50.BURNSIDE Award for Engineering

\$300

In the spirit of the Burnside Corporate Values, this award is presented to a student who has demonstrated strong character and is pursuing studies in Engineering at the university or college level.

51.CANADIAN Federation of University Women's Club (CFUW) of Stratford Merit Award

\$350

Awarded annually to a female student from Stratford Central Secondary School who has shown great improvement, but has not necessarily received the highest mark. The recipient must be enrolled at a post secondary institution immediately following secondary school.

52.Courtney CUNNINGHAM Memorial Award

Book and Gift Certificate

Award recognizes the writer in EWC4U who has demonstrated the greatest growth in skill and insight.

53. GALLERY 96 Scholarship

\$100

Awarded to a graduating student pursuing a post graduate diploma in Visual Arts.

54. MUSIC COUNCIL AWARDS SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to one or more music student as determined by Mrs. Ortelli. This student is usually continuing education in music.

55. **TEAHEN Construction Ltd Plumbing and Design Group Skilled Trades Award**

\$300

Awarded to a recipient who:

- Has exhibited superior academic abilities
- May have participated in OYAP placement related to the construction industry
- Participated in Technological Education related to the construction industry
- Must be pursuing a construction industry apprenticeship or attending a postsecondary institution construction industry program

56. Stratford and Area BUILDERS' Association Construction Skilled Trades Award

\$300

Awarded to a recipient who:

- Has exhibited superior academic abilities
- May have participated in OYAP placement related to the construction industry
- Participated in Technological Education related to the construction industry
- Must be pursuing a construction industry apprenticeship or attending a postsecondary institution construction industry program

57. REXFORD L. EVELEIGH Mathematics Scholarship

\$1000

Awarded annually to a graduating student that is the hardest working math student. The individual does not necessarily have to have the best mark. Individuals are nominated by a teacher or fellow student. Nominators will be required to submit a short paragraph on why the individual should receive the scholarship.

58. SIGN ONTARIO – Design and Art Scholarship

\$500

Awarded to a graduating student going to post-secondary in a field related to design and art.
